Q. Which state or local tax that you pay would you say is too high – property taxes, income taxes, sales taxes, or gas taxes?

Property Taxes	55%

METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 500 likely general election voters in Nebraska and the margin of error is +/-4.4%. Responses were gathered via landline interviews conducted with Interactive Voice Response (IVR) technology. The survey was conducted April 27-30, 2017 by Harper Polling. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
